Proposal for a learning project

Each Matmidot Scholar will choose a topic to extensively research, under the guidance of a faculty mentor, and will ultimately publish a written article for the Matmidot Lindenbaum Torah Journal.

Please submit a proposal for a Tanach/Gemara/Halacha/Machshevet Yisrael project that you would like to pursue as a Matmidot Scholar at Midreshet Lindenbaum.

Your proposal should include all of the following elements:

- Question you would like to examine/thesis you would like to explore
 - History - What is your motivation to pursue this project? Why is this question/thesis significant to you?
- References to other literature/resources that have already explored this or a similar question or topic (if relevant)
- Description of methods/resources will you use to investigate this subject
- Possible outcomes or results of your work
- Impact - how will your research contribute to the Torah community
